PROGRAM NOTE

Spirit of Liberty was composed to commemorate the 250th Anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence and to honor the enduring friendship between France and the United States. The work is inspired by the historic journey of the Marquis de Lafayette, who traveled from France to support the American colonies in their fight for independence.

The music opens with a solemn, mysterious atmosphere, evoking Lafayette's departure from the French coast and the uncertainty of the voyage ahead. Gradually, increased motion and energy portray the Atlantic crossing, culminating in a more assertive and energetic section that represents Lafayette's arrival in America and his participation in the revolutionary struggle.

A calm, reflective central passage follows, symbolizing the signing of the Declaration of Independence and a moment of unity and fraternity among nations. The work concludes by looking toward the future, as earlier themes return with renewed confidence, suggesting that the spirit of liberty—and Lafayette's journey—continues beyond this historic moment.

NOTES TO CONDUCTOR

Throughout the piece, the Chimes part (played by Mallet 1 or Mallet 2) is particularly important for color. If the band doesn't have Chimes, this part should not be replaced by bells, but rather by a synthesizer with a Chimes sound. In the very first part of the piece, some instruments of the band instill a mysterious atmosphere while some sections play quotes from *The Star Spangled Banner* (m. 6-7, m. 11-12), and *La Marseillaise*, the French National Anthem (m. 10-11). This should be explained to the players to help them play those musical phrases clearly.

Measures 30-37, the counterpoint played by the Flutes, Oboes, and 1st Clarinets must be rehearsed conscientiously to be sure to be played accurately, respecting all the articulations and slurs.

From m. 59, this part of the piece needs to be really precise in terms of overall balance. The Clarinet section provides the accompaniment, the Oboe plays the melody, and the Vibraphone plays arpeggios.

Measure 77, for the second time, the counter melody played by the Tenor Saxophone, Horns, and Vibraphone has to be played loud enough to make sure that the band understands there is a new musical line and this section is not a simple repeat. At the end of the piece, the quotes of the national anthems come back, but through different forms. The National Anthem of the United States is heard from m. 116 to m. 120, and the French National Anthem from m. 120 to m. 122. Again, those motives need to be highlighted. The very end must be quite energetic; the quarter notes played at m. 122-123 by the Saxophones, Horns, and Chimes should be accentuated. On the last measure, all sounds must be cut off (percussion dampen).

ABOUT THE COMPOSER



Alexandre Carlin is a music teacher, composer and band conductor from France. He began playing the clarinet and after classical studies, he decided to enroll at the University of Paris Sorbonne. He discovered orchestral conducting and writing for band with Désiré Dondeyne, former conductor of the french police symphonic band of Paris.

In 2012 he followed composer Stéphane Bortoli's composition classes at the Mantes en Yvelines conservatory. The same year, he also took lessons in film music composition at the Levallois-Perret conservatory. He became associate professor of music in 2020.

Since 1996 he has been director of the « Société Musicale de Bû », conducting the beginning band and the concert band, and managing the music school. Since 2014 he is also a music teacher at Charles de Gaulle middle school in Bû and since 2020 at Rotrou high school in Dreux.

A member of SACEM since 1995, his catalog consists of original works for concert band, brass band, young band, instrumental pieces for competitions and exams, and arrangements.

He currently lives in France, 60 kms south-west of Paris, with his wife Ingrid, and their three children Fiona, Sean and Eileen.

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
