## The Arranger

Dr. Robert McCashin, Director of Orchestras and Professor of Conducting at James Madison University, has enjoyed a long career encompassing all aspects of music. He received bachelor's and master's degrees in violin performance from Louisiana State University and a doctorate in conducting from the University of Arizona. After several years as a teacher and performer, he has pursued a successful path as a conductor for groups ranging from professional regional orchestras to university orchestras, youth orchestras, and state and regional honor orchestras at the junior and senior high school level. Dr. McCashin's expertise in conducting pedagogy and violin performance physiology has allowed him to participate in numerous seminars, master classes, and presentations throughout the country. He serves as the ASTA/NSOA College Chair for the Virginia state chapter and maintains a busy adjudicating schedule at the regional and national levels.

## Performance Notes

Robert Schumann's musical gift was obvious when he began studying piano at an early age. After the death of his father (who zealously nurtured his son's musical development), Schumann's mother decided that he should pursue a career in law. Schumann soon developed a complete aversion to law school and to the atmosphere of student life, but eventually found his true path through involvement in literary and musical circles. After many struggles, he began to grasp the larger symphonic forms, expressing his passionate feelings through the completion of *Symphony in D Minor* in 1841. This arrangement of the first movement opens with the hauntingly beautiful theme. The piece builds in power and majesty, then evolves toward a stirring and flashy *Allegro* section.

Bow markings placed within parentheses indicate staggered bow changes. Parts should be divisi only when necessary. Otherwise, double stops and chords should not be divided among players.
