The Arranger

Carrie Lane Gruselle is a native of Stevens Point, Wisconsin. She received a Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Wisconsin–Eau Claire, and a Master of Music Education degree, Suzuki Emphasis, from the University of Wisconsin–Stevens Point. Ms. Gruselle currently teaches elementary and middle level strings for the Appleton Area School District in Appleton, Wisconsin, and teaches for the Lawrence University Academy of Music. Her arrangements and compositions for beginning and developing string players have been performed across the nation and in Australia.

About the Music

Deep River is an African American spiritual, one of the first spirituals to move from the realm of folk music to the concert stage as proper art music, thanks to the work of H.T. Burleigh, a late-18th and early 19th century African American composer. He brought to the public eye the depth and beauty of the spiritual through his published arrangements for solo voice and piano.

In this arrangement, students explore long, lyrical, expressive phrases. Musicians are encouraged to focus on tone production, clarity of sound, purity of intonation, and vibrato. Technical demands include slurs, accidentals, and minimal shifting in the bass and divisi violin 1 parts.
