About the Music

Make the renaissance come alive with this courtly dance by Susato. This dance, composed in 1551 for his book of dances called *The Danserye*, epitomizes the harmonies, rhythms, and style of that exciting time. On the easy side of Grade 2, this arrangement is very playable for developing groups.

To the Conductor

This is an arrangement of a *basse* dance where partners move quietly and gracefully in a slow gliding motion with their feet staying in contact with the floor. Since it is a dance, it should be played with rhythmic vitality. Be careful if you play this at the end of the period or day; the catchy melody is likely to stick with you for quite some time. Enjoy!
