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The Composer

Brian Balmages (b. 1975) is an award-winning composer, conductor, producer, and performer. The music he has written for winds, brass, and orchestra has been performed throughout the world with commissions ranging from elementary schools to professional orchestras. World premieres include prestigious venues such as Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, and Meyerhoff Symphony Hall. His music was also performed as part of the 2013 Presidential Inaugural Prayer Service, which was attended by both President Obama and Vice President Biden. He received his bachelor's degree in music from James Madison University and his master's degree from the University of Miami in Florida. He is a recipient of the prestigious A. Austin Harding Award from the American School Band Directors Association and in 2016 was awarded the James Madison University Distinguished Alumni Award from the School of Visual and Performing Arts (the first year the award was given). In the same year, he was commissioned by his other alma mater, the University of Miami, to compose music for the inauguration of the institution's 6th president, Dr. Julio Frenk.

As a conductor, Mr. Balmages enjoys regular engagements with all-state and region bands and orchestras, as well as university and professional ensembles throughout the world. Notable guest conducting appearances have included the Midwest Clinic, Western International Band Clinic, College Band Directors Conference, American School Band Directors Association National Conference and others. Additional conducting appearances have included the Kennedy Center and Meyerhoff Symphony Hall as well as engagements in Australia, Canada and Italy. Currently, he is Director of Instrumental Publications for The FJH Music Company and Assistant Director of Bands and Orchestras at Towson University.

Program Notes

Commissioned by the Hauser Junior High School music program in honor of the retirement of orchestra director Patricia Gill, *A Riverside Celebration* is an energetic piece that captures the energy and playfulness of the students that thrived under her direction for many years. Opening immediately with a driving energetic rhythm, the music features a dance-like, memorable melody intentionally designed to stay with the listener long after the piece is over (reflective of how music teachers never "really" retire!). The music moves in and out of some simple meter changes that help create additional momentum as the music develops. In addition to the opening energetic section, there are moments of slight restraint (such as measure 48) and just carefree childlike fun (such as measure 96). Rhythm, of course, plays a critical role in the piece, ultimately creating the entire canvas on which the melodic lines are painted. Optional percussion is included, but not required. In this particular case, Patty began her career as a general music teacher, so adding some simple percussion instruments both enhanced the celebratory nature of the piece and paid homage to her roots as a teacher of Orff instruments.

Musicians should not be afraid to dig into the string and bring out the syncopated rhythms throughout the piece. I would suggest having all students play the violin rhythm in measure 1 together (all other instruments have it later in the piece – viola in measure 5, cello in measure 9, and bass in measure 17). Having everyone play it at the same time will really allow them to focus on matching articulation, note length, and overall style. Teachers should also note that adding percussion will significantly help stabilize the ensemble, so I strongly encourage using student percussionists if they are available!
