The Arranger

About the Music

There are as many traditions connected to the Christmas season as there are those who celebrate it. Whether focusing on Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, or Christmas Night, the associated traditions carry great meaning to many.

In this arrangement, morning is represented by *I Saw Three Ships*, an English Carol which was popular in the 19th century but is likely considerably older.

I saw three ships come sailing in

On Christmas Day on Christmas Day.

And all the bells on Earth shall ring

On Christmas Day in the morning

The lilting 6/8 suggests the rolling waves; the dotted halves at measure 9 suggest the bells ringing.

At measure 54, we have moved from daytime to nighttime with *The Sussex Carol*, which originated in the 17th century but has seen many changes over the years throughout the British Isles.

On Christmas night all Christians sing

To hear the news the angels bring

Bowing can be problematic in 6/8 time because of the jagged rhythm of alternating quarters and eighths. Hooking the bows (see viola, measure 13) is one solution. Otherwise, take care to keep the eighth note up-bow light and fast, in order to return to the point of departure for the next quarter note (see violins in measure 21, lower strings at measure 35).

Also note that there are several possible fingerings for the bass in measures 35-36. This is just one suggestion.

The piece should be conducted with two beats per measure, except where the 9/8 measures require three beats.
