## The Arranger

Carrie Lane Gruselle is recently retired from teaching strings for the Appleton Area School District in Appleton, Wisconsin. Actively involved with the Wisconsin MEA Comprehensive Musicianship through Performance Project, she is also past president of the Wisconsin Chapter of the American String Teachers Association and former lead teacher for the Lawrence University String Project. She is string editor for The FJH Music Company, and co-author of the new FJH method series: Measures of Success® for Strings. The arrangements and compositions she has written for young string players are studied and performed regularly worldwide.

Ms. Gruselle holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree from UW-Eau Claire and a Masters of Music Education with Suzuki Emphasis from UW-Stevens Point.

#### **About the Music**

Johann Sebastian Bach gathered up some of his ideas, old and new, to create a collection known today as the *Brandenburg Concertos*. These Concertos utilized various and sometimes unique groupings of instruments, featuring a small highlighted group interacting with the remaining musicians, in a style known as Concerto Grosso. He titled the group: *Six Concertos for several instruments*. Because he presented them to the Margrave of Brandenburg-Schwedt, they became known as the *Brandenburg Concertos*. Here you will find familiar melodies from numbers 2, 3, and 5.

These Concertos (or Concerti) are iconic examples of Baroque chamber music. To appropriately replicate the style, students will use a marcato or martelé (stopped) bow on quarter notes, and a fluid detaché on eighth notes (connected).

The score supplies dynamics to indicate which section has the melody since the thick polyphonic texture could obscure the tune.

Violins and violas remain in first position but require low and high second fingers and high third fingers.

Cellos may be entirely in first position (with no extensions), but there is an optional opportunity to use second position at measure 26 where they play the melody.

Basses use 1st and 3rd positions. For those wanting to explore, they can stay in 3rd position at measure 26 through the end of the phrase by pivoting first finger back for the F#, and returning it to G and A in 3rd position.
